



That she is the widow of Samuel Taylor late of said Danbury deceased who was a Private and Musician in the army of the Revolution and served during the Revolutionary war as a private soldier and musician in the Continental line under the command of the officers specified and named in the original declaration of the said Samuel Taylor now on file in the office of the Commissioner of Pensions in the War Department and for the several terms and periods of time mentioned in the said declaration and inasmuch as she has no personal knowledge of the various particulars relative to his said service - of the several times when his terms of service commenced and ended or the names of the officers under whom he served of the country through which he marched or of the battles in which he was engaged she refers to said original decla-

-ration for a more particular description thereof -
That said Samuel Taylor was a Revolutionary
Pensioner of the United States from the eighteen
day of December one thousand eight hundred
and forty one to the time of his death at the
rate of thirty ~~two~~ eight dollars and sixty six
cents per annum - said Taylor receiving back
pay from the 4th day of March 1881 - which said
pension was granted to him for the services
aforesaid - and she refers for proof of such
facts to the evidence accompanying his said
original declaration also on file in the office
of said Commissioner of Pensions - She further
declares that she was married to the said Sam-
uel Taylor previous to the 1st day of January
to wife on the ~~sixth~~ day of March ~~one~~ ^{one} hundred and eighty one
eighteen hundred, for proof of which said mar-
riage she refers to her accompanying affidavit
of Waters H. Olmstead of said Danbury who is the
Town Clerk of said Town of Danbury. She further
declares that the said Samuel Taylor died on the
twenty sixth day of October 1848 at said Danbury and
for proof of his said death she refers to the
accompanying certificate of the Court of Probate
for the District of Danbury within said county of
Fairfield and state of Connecticut. She further
declares that she has never intermarried since the
death of said Samuel Taylor but still continues
to be the widow of the said Samuel Taylor
